



## GUIDELINES FOR Responding to Personal Prophetic Ministry

- **Write** out your prophecy.  
**Listen** to the recording frequently.  
There is an anointing as it is spoken.

- Consider your prophecy **prayerfully** and **meditate** on it.

- **Review** your prophecy with your church leadership.

- **Judge** and weigh the word according to the Biblical principles.

- **Reflect** on the prophecy to understand if God is requiring something of you in order to see the prophecy fulfilled.

- **Examine** the prophecy for a specific time frame. **Remember** that God is rarely in a hurry. God works His purposes over the course of our lives.

- **Understand** that in giving to us personal prophecies, God is not interested in informing us so much as He is interested in transforming us unto the character of Christ.

## Guidelines for delivering with grace what God has revealed

### **Prophetiquette:**

*“But everyone who prophesies speaks to men for their strengthening, encouragement and comfort.”*

### **EDIFY! EDIFY! EDIFY!**

- Prophecy out of a humble, sensitive and pure spirit.
- Remember that revelation never trumps scriptures, authority, or love for another.
- Prophecy clearly and concisely, not adding to what the Holy Spirit has spoken.
- Have prayerful interpretations for any dreams and visions.
- Respect the authority you are under following the designated design for the prophetic.
- Timing is key. Consider if now is God’s time and setting to deliver this word.
- Refrain from prophesying into delicate areas, like marriage, babies, etc.
- When you are wrong, be humble enough to admit it. We all make mistakes.
